October 6, 2008

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Nebraska City was conducted in the Council Chambers of City Hall, 1409 Central Avenue, on October 6, 2008. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by posting in at least three public places, the designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Certificate of Posting Notice attached to these minutes.

Mayor Adelung called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Upon roll call the following answered present: Leon Schiermeyer, Dean Handy, Erv Friesen, and Mark Mercer. The following City Officials were present: City Administrator Scott Bovick, City Clerk Arnold M. Ehlers, City Attorney William Davis, Police Chief David Lacy, Building Inspector Alan Viox and Public Properties Director/Zoning Director Dan Gittinger.

Mayor Adelung led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Commissioner Friesen moved to approve the minutes of the September 15, 2008 City Council Regular Meeting. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Handy, Mercer, Friesen and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion adopted.

Commissioner Schiermeyer moved to approve the minutes of the September 29, 2008 Special Meeting. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Mercer, Friesen, Handy, Schiermeyer and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion passed.

Commissioner Schiermeyer moved to approve the minutes of the October 6, 2008 Special Meeting. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Mercer, Friesen, Handy, Schiermeyer and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion passed.

Mayor Adelung opened the public hearing for the preliminary plat for Arbor View Subdivision, described as all of Block 68 except Part of Lots 1,2,3 and 18 and all Block 71 plus streets and alleys through said Blocks in Kearney Addition. Scott Bovick presented information regarding the request. No one else spoke in support or opposition to the request. Commissioner Handy moved to close the public hearing. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Mercer, Friesen, Handy and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Mayor Adelung opened the public hearing to consider final plat for TMM Subdivision located in the North half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 27, Township 8 North; Range 14 East; of the 6<sup>th</sup> Principal Meridian; Otoe County. Scott Bovick provided information on this request. No one else spoke in support or opposition to the request. Commissioner Handy moved to close the public hearing. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Mercer, Friesen, Handy and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Mayor Adelung opened the public hearing for the Annual Report on the status of the City of Nebraska City Economic Development Program Funds (LB840). Pat Haverty, Executive Director of River Country Economic Development Corporation provided charts and information on the allocation of funds and how they were spent. Haverty stated that all funds were not spent last fiscal year and with the additional funds this year larger projects will be able to be funded. No one else spoke in support or opposition at the hearing. Commissioner Handy moved to close the public hearing. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Mercer, Friesen, Handy and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Mayor Adelung proclaimed October as "Physical Therapy Month."

Scott Bovick reported that Nebraska City received another Owner-Occupied Rehabilitation Housing Grant in the amount of \$272,000.00.

The Annual Treasurer's Report was presented. Beginning Balance October 1, 2007 - \$4,177,553.65; Revenues - \$6,978,644.56; Expenses - \$7,539,601.09; Ending Balance September 30, 2008 - \$3,616,597.12. Commissioner Friesen moved to accept the Annual Treasurer's Report. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Handy, Mercer, Friesen and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion adopted.

Wyuka Cemetery Month-End Report was received.

Commissioner Handy moved to approve the Final Plat of TMM Subdivision. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Friesen, Mercer, Schiermeyer, Handy and Mayor Adelung. Voting NO: None. Motion passed.

Commissioner Mercer moved to approve the Preliminary Plat of Arbor View Estates. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Handy, Friesen, Mercer and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. Motion carried.

Scott Bovick provided information on the status of the Rowe Memorial Public Safety Complex and introduced Dean Fajen of HGM to present the plans and specifications for the complex as well as cost estimates. Commissioner Handy moved to approve the plans and specifications for the Rowe Memorial Public Safety Complex and authorize staff to advertise for bids. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Friesen, Mercer, Schiermeyer, Handy and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. Motion passed.

Scott Bovick provided information on a request by Fran Biskup to purchase a strip of vacated right-of-way located on the East side of 3<sup>rd</sup> Street South of 10<sup>th</sup> Corso. Commissioner Handy moved to direct the City Attorney to draft an ordinance vacating that portion of right-of-way. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Friesen, Mercer, Schiermeyer, Handy and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. Motion passed.

Commissioner Friesen moved to accept the Annual Report on the status of the City of Nebraska City Economic Development Program Funds (LB840).

Scott Bovick presented information on the status of the 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue Watershed Area. Bovick stated that JEO Consulting has been contacted and will do a "Drainage Study" for \$12,900.00. Bill Ault 1223 N. 14<sup>th</sup> Street; Patrick Wehling 1239 N. 14<sup>th</sup> Street; and Vernon McGowen 1205 N 14<sup>th</sup> Street all support the study. Commissioner Friesen moved to award the contract for the 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue Drainage Study to JEO. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Handy, Mercer, Friesen and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. Motion adopted.

Commissioner Friesen moved to approve the recommendation by the Board of Public Works to approve of Work Order #146 in the amount of \$18,084.26 for the installation of electric service to Riverview Park contingent upon Trailblazers receiving a grant in the amount of \$5,045.18. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Handy, Mercer, Friesen and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. Motion adopted.

Commissioner Friesen moved to approve the recommendation by the Board of Public Works to approve of Work Order #206 in the amount of \$35,616.26 to extend a gas main North of Syracuse. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Handy, Mercer, Friesen and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. Motion adopted.

Commissioner Friesen moved to approve the recommendation by the Board of Public Works to purchase a Counter Flow Cooling Tower in the amount of \$74,495.00 plus tax. Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Handy, Mercer, Friesen and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. Motion adopted.

Mayor Adelong introduced Ordinance 2734-08:

AN ORDINANCE CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 2008-02 IN THE CITY OF NEBRASKA CITY, NEBRASKA, ORDERING THE CONSTRUCTION OF STREET IMPROVEMENTS THEREIN AND ORDERING THE PUBLICATION OF THE ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM, and moved that the statutory rule requiring reading on three different days be suspended. Commissioner Handy seconded the motion and upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Mercer, Friesen, Handy and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. The motion to suspend the rules was adopted by three-fifths of the Board and the statutory rule was declared suspended for consideration of said ordinance.

Said ordinance was then read by title and thereafter Mayor Adelong moved for final passage of the ordinance, which motion was seconded by Commissioner Friesen. Bill Moore 1759 N. 11<sup>th</sup> informed the council that there is a drainage problem on North 11<sup>th</sup> near his house. Dan Giittinger stated that he would look at the problem. The Mayor stated the question – "Shall Ordinance No. 2734-08 be passed and adopted?" Upon roll call the following voted AYE: Schiermeyer, Mercer, Handy, Friesen and Mayor Adelong. Voting NO: None. The passage and adoption of said ordinance having been concurred in by a majority of all members of the Board, the Mayor declared the ordinance adopted and the Mayor in the presence of the Board signed and approved the ordinance and the Clerk attested the passage and approval of the same and affixed his signature thereto and ordered the Ordinance to be published in pamphlet form as provided therein. A true, correct and complete copy of said ordinance is as follows:

**Ordinance 2734-08**

AN ORDINANCE CREATING STREET IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NO. 2008-02 IN THE CITY OF NEBRASKA CITY, NEBRASKA, ORDERING THE CONSTRUCTION OF STREET

IMPROVEMENTS THEREIN AND ORDERING THE PUBLICATION OF THE ORDINANCE IN PAMPHLET FORM:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF NEBRASKA CITY, NEBRASKA, as follows:

Section 1. That there be and hereby is created in the City of Nebraska City, Nebraska, a paving district to be known and designated as Street Improvement District No. 2008-02 of the City of Nebraska City, Nebraska.

Section 2. That the outer boundaries of Street Improvement District No. 2008-02 shall include, in addition to the streets to be improved, all of the following property abutting upon said streets to be improved and within which district, the following streets shall be improved by milling and overlay, curb repair as needed, constructing ADA compliant crosswalks and all necessary appurtenances thereto are:

10<sup>th</sup> Street from 100 feet South of 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 150 feet North of 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue;

11<sup>th</sup> Street from 100 feet South of 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue to 150 feet North of 16<sup>th</sup> Avenue

14<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 10<sup>th</sup> Street to 11<sup>th</sup> Street; and

16<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 10<sup>th</sup> Street to 11<sup>th</sup> Street;

which streets are found to be interconnecting streets; and

13<sup>th</sup> Avenue from 7<sup>th</sup> Street to 9<sup>th</sup> Street.

Section 3. Said streets shall be improved at public cost and said improvements shall be made in accordance with the plans, specifications and estimate prepared by the special engineers for the City and to be approved by the Mayor and Board of Commissioners.

Section 4. Notice of creation of said District shall be published as provided by law in the *Nebraska City News-Press*, a legal newspaper published in and of general circulation in Nebraska City, Nebraska.

Section 5. This ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form and take effect as provided by law.

Building Inspector Alan Viox presented information on the condition of the structure located at 807 Central Avenue and asked the Council to make a formal determination that the building is unsafe and that the owner be notified to remedy the condition or demolish. Property owner Farzad Eskandari 602 1<sup>st</sup> Avenue Apt #1 stated that the when he purchased the building it was not in that poor of condition, but that a bad winter had caused the damage. He stated that he could not afford to repair the building nor demolish the building due to costs. Mr. Eskandari offered to sell the property to the City for less than he paid for it. Scott Bovick said the City could not spend tax dollars for the property but the owner could appeal the decision within 10days. If neither of those options occurred condemnation would proceed in 30 days.
