ARPA is a \$1.9 trillion dollar package intended to combat the public health and economic impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic. ARPA allocates hundreds of billions of dollars nationally for public health and vaccines, assistance for vulnerable populations, education and housing stabilization, economic recovery assistance, and direct assistance for families and individuals.

Nebraska City will receive more than \$1.29 million dollars in Local Relief Funds from ARPA. The Town Hall meeting will begin our community-wide discussion exploring how Nebraska City can use this once-in-a-generation investment of federal funds. The City is interested in hearing your thoughts on potential projects or programs that will impact our community. The City has until December 31, 2024 to allocate these funds to projects or programs.

The Town Hall will be held in the Council Chambers at the Rowe Building, 1518 Central Ave, Nebraska City, NE. Each of the three meetings will start at 6:00PM.
