## CITY OF NEBRASKA CITY, NEBRASKA MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL REGULAR MEETING January 16, 2023

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a Regular Meeting of the City Council of the City of Nebraska City was conducted in the Gary White Memorial Room of the Rowe Safety Complex, 1518 Central Avenue and by video conference on the Zoom meeting platform, on January 16, 2023. Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication in the local paper and by posting in at least three public places, the designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Certificate of Posting Notice attached to these minutes. The agenda was made available via the City Website and communicated in advance to the media, Mayor and Commissioners of this proceeding and said meeting was open to the public.

Mayor Bryan Bequette called the meeting to order at 6:02 P.M. Council acknowledged receipt of Utility Claims for period ending July 2022.

Council discussed Airport Authority projects and funding avenues and agreed by unanimous consent that they would be willing to enter into an interlocal agreement with the Airport Authority Board until the Bond is paid off in 2025. Moved by Commissioner Chaney and seconded by Wehling to approve the Residential Master Plan and consider Phase 1 of the Residential Development Master Plan. Marty Stovall spoke to explain the item. Moved by Commissioner Wehling and seconded by Osovski to approve **Resolution 2926-23** to approve the Step Pay Schedule with corrected steps to include the 4% COLA.
